

et me first express that I am delighted, that after the COVID-19 pandemic, ■the 4th Luxembourg Poland Business Conference can finally take place at the Embassy of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg in Warsaw. One of the initiators of these cyclic events, Luxembourg -Poland Chamber of Commerce (LPCC), has become an indispensable partner of the Embassy in its economic diplomacy activity. I am convinced that together with its younger sister Polsko Luksemburska Izba Gospodarcza (PLIG), with its new President, it will further boost economic relations between Luxembourg and Poland. Topics of the previous business conferences have been selected in order to detect sectors with the best potential for the fruitful bilateral cooperation. Today, we want to concentrate on sustainable (including green) finance and digital, which might seem like two distinct issues, but really, they are twin challenges that can help deliver Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to the world's biggest challenges - ranging from poverty and gender, inequality, and finally closing the financing gap of climate change. COVID-19 pandemic and the war in Ukraine with its consequences imperiled the progress toward development of SDGs. The ever more frequent crisis require even more focus on sustainable energy, food and digital transitions. Sustainable Digital Finance (SDF) can help in the realisation of this difficult but necessary task. SDF refers to financing tools, as well as related institutional and market arrangements, that leverage technological ecosystems to contribute to

the attainment of sustainable, balanced and inclusive growth, by directly and indirectly supporting the targets set in the SDGs.

Luxembourg has always been in avantgarde with regard to SDGs, especially environmental issues and in parallel innovative solutions for the financial sector. The best proof of that is the launch of the first green stock exchange in the World Luxembourg Green Exchange (LGX), where in 2016, the Republic of Poland issued the first sovereign Green Bond in history. Thus, Luxembourg and Poland together became key players in innovative efforts in finance industry. As Luxembourg supports innovation and startups through many programs introduced by Luxinnovation and Polish startups are highly appreciated in Luxembourg, together we can become leaders of the SDF. I am confident that our conference, almost two years after having celebrated the Centenary of our bilateral diplomatic relations, will be a great opportunity to further develop and find interested partners for such cooperation.

Introduction

am very pleased to meet you at this Business Conference. The unflagging interest in in this event demonstrates the success of this joint initiative, which we owe to the Luxembourg-Poland Chamber of Commerce and the Polsko Luksemburska Izba Gospodarcza. I am convinced that together we will be able to realise many more thriving projects.

Mr Ambassador Schmit is right to point out that combining digitalisation with sustainability may seem difficult. The energy-intensive nature of crypto-currencies or the problem of greenwashing raise many questions that need to be answered to address the ongoing crises. We are in a period of transition, and the outbreak of war in Ukraine is a catalyst for change.

Since application of new solutions will involve considerable resources (according to McKinsey forecast even 60% increase compared to actual level of investment related to energy and land-use systems only), the banking sector will have a significant role to play in achieving long-term climate goals. The latest Global Green Finance Index ranks Luxembourg 4th in the world, which confirms its status as a reliable partner in sustainable financing. Although the Polish green bond market is relatively limited, the KPMG report carried out as part of the Polish Capital Market Development Strategy shows that Poland has great potential in this area.

Working together creates opportunities to learn from each other's experiences for mutual benefit. Luxembourg and Poland are aware that

tackling the climate change is both a challenge and an opportunity. Many chances are created here by the advancing digitalisation. Research from the World Economic Forum's Digital Transformation Initiative and Accenture estimates that by 2050 scaled digital technologies can deliver up to 20% of the reductions we need in three high emission industries: energy, materials, and mobility. It is worth noting that according to the Digital Economy and Society Index (DESI) 2022, Poland is among the top five countries making the fastest progress in digitalisation.

In my opinion this is due to an excellent education in IT. The expertise and talents of the Polish professionals obviously represent a special value for as talent-oriented country as Luxembourg. The joint efforts to achieve targets of the Digital Decade are reflected, among others, in the plan to connect our two countries within the EuroHPC quantum computers network. Further development of digital services will require improved regulations, which we are preparing for. The Polish Cloud 2.0 Standard, recommended last year by the Polish Bank Association, is just one example. We expect much more to be communicated at our next 5th Business Conference, to be held at the end of 2023, which will focus on cybersecurity in the financial sector. There is no doubt that both events will not only provide an opportunity to exchange views on really topical issues, but they will also give additional momentum for related joint projects.

Mrs Yuriko Backes Minister of Finance of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg

Mrs Yuriko Backes is a graduate of the International Relations at London School of Economics and Political Science, Japanese studies at the School of Oriental and African Studies in London as well as of European political and administrative studies at the College of Europe in Bruges. After a diplomatic career within the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, she became the diplomatic adviser and Sherpa to Luxembourg Prime Ministers Jean-Claude Juncker and Xavier Bettel. She was the representative of the European Commission in Luxembourg from 2016 to 2020. From June 2020 until her appointment to the government in January 2022, she served as Marshal of the Grand-Ducal Court.



Mrs Magdalena Rzeczkowska Minister of Finance of the Republic of Poland

Mrs Magdalena Rzeczkowska is graduate of the Law and Administration Faculty and postgraduate studies in European integration at the Warsaw University. Since 2002, she works for the Ministry of Finance of the Republic of Poland, where in 2020 she was appointed Secretary of State and the Head of the National Revenue Administration and in April 2022 Minister of Finance. She initiated and coordinated many innovative legal and digital solutions, among them digitalization of custom proceedings. In 2022, she was promoted to the rank of superintendent of the Customs and Fiscal Service in the general corps.

Mr Paul Schmit Ambassador of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg in Warsaw

Mr Paul Schmit studied law at the University of Strasbourg and political science at Paris II University. After his studies, he joined the Luxembourg civil service, firstly in the Ministry of Defence, then in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, where he has served since 1992. He has completed several foreign missions, including Brussels (Permanent Representations to NATO and to the European Union), Washington and Lisbon. Since 2020, he is Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Grand Duchy Luxembourg to the Republic of Poland. He is also accredited to the Republic of Latvia and to the Republic of Lithuania.



Mr Piotr Wojtczak
Ambassador of the Republic of Poland in Luxembourg

Mr Piotr Wojtczak is a graduate of Political Science and Roman Philology (French literature and language) at the University of Maria Skłodowska-Curie in Lublin, as well as the National School of Public Administration in Warsaw. He started his diplomatic career in 1994. He specializes in European Union issues, especially in justice and home affairs. In the Ministry, he performed the functions of Deputy Director in the European Department, Director General of the Foreign Service and Chief of Protocol. Missions abroad: Minister-Counsellor in the Representation of the Republic of Poland to the European Union (during the accession negotiations), DCM in the Embassy of the Republic of Poland in Brussels, Permanent Representative of Poland to the EU. In 2017 he presented his credentials as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Republic of Poland to the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg. He has held the position of Dean of the Diplomatic Corps in Luxembourg since May 2022.

Mrs Teresa Czerwińska Vice-President, European Investment Bank

Mrs Teresa Czerwińska was appointed the Vice President of the European Investment Bank in March 2020. In this role, alongside looking after the constituency countries (Poland, Hungary, Croatia) she is responsible for Eastern Partnership countries as well as for Central Asia, China and Mongolia. She also oversees the matters of science, education, innovation, digital economy, and the InvestEU programme. Prior to becoming EIB Vice-President, Mrs Czerwińska was a member of the management board of the National Bank of Poland, Minister of Finance of the Republic of Poland, when she was also a Governor of the European Investment Bank. Earlier she held the position of the Undersecretary of State being responsible for the state budget at the Ministry of Finance. Before, in the years 2015 - 2017, she was the Undersecretary of State in the Ministry of Science and Higher Education. Teresa Czerwińska is a Professor of Economics at the Warsaw University specialising in finances and risk management.


